



**Announcement of the Royal Thai Embassy, Canberra  
on Requirements for Foreign Passengers Travelling to the Kingdom of Thailand**

In accordance with Articles 3 and 5 of the Notification of the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand on Practical Guideline for Air Operators Performing Flights into the Kingdom of Thailand dated 19 March B.E. 2563 (2020), foreign passengers of all nationalities travelling to the Kingdom of Thailand are required to present the following documents to air operators at the time of check-in:

1. Health certificate certifying that the passengers pose no risk of being infected by the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19). The health certificate must be issued no more than 72 hours prior to the date of travel; and
2. Health insurance policy that shows minimum medical coverage in Thailand of the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), in the amount not less than 100,000 USD.

If the passengers are unable to present the abovementioned required documentation, the air operator shall not issue a boarding pass and the boarding shall be denied.

These requirements will be effective from 22 March B.E. 2563 (2020) at 00.00 hours (Thailand local time).

### Summary of Practical Guidelines for Air Operators

<b>Upon Check-in</b>	<p>Require the presentation of;</p> <p>(1) Health certificate certifying that the passengers "pose no risk of being infected by the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)", issued no more than 72 hours prior to the date of travel.</p> <p>(2) Health insurance/health insurance policy that shows minimum medical coverage of 100,000 USD in Thailand and covers the Covid-19 Disease</p> <p><b>Note:</b> If the passenger is unable to present the required above documents, the air operator shall not issue a boarding pass and the boarding shall be denied.</p>	<p>Require the presentation of;</p> <p>(1) Health certificate confirming that the passenger is fit to fly</p> <p>(2) Letter issued by Royal Thai Embassy, Thai Consular Office or Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Kingdom of Thailand certifying that the passenger is Thai National returning to Thailand.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> If the passenger is unable to present the required above document, the air operator shall not issue a boarding pass and the boarding shall be denied.</p>
<b>Upon Receiving Boarding Pass</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Arrange seats to passengers with the greatest possible distance apart from each other when issuing boarding passes</li> <li>2. Arrange for passengers to provide information on the address in Thailand in the T.8 Form or in "AOT Airport of Thailand" Application.</li> </ol>	
<b>On Board</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Inform passengers on how to protect themselves from communicable diseases, such as wearing masks at all time.</li> <li>2. Limit services in the passenger cabin</li> <li>3. Require all flight attendants to wear masks</li> </ol>	
<b>Entry to Thailand (Passenger's Duty)</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Present to the communicable disease control official:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) Health Certificate / Insurance Policy</li> <li>(2) Completed T8 Form or "AOT Airport of Thailand" Application</li> </ol> </li> <li>2.
